INFORMATION About the courses

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Presentations are interactive lecture-style courses with small- and large-group discussion for participants.

Workshops combine lecture, small- and large-group work, along with hands-on practice.

SERIES DESCRIPTIONS

Brief but In-Depth Series

These *workshops* work well at conferences since they can be customized in length, starting at just three hours. Longer sessions are also available making the sessions less brief but no less in-depth.

Lecture Series

Presentations last from three to six hours. Longer sessions provide more work for participants.

Presenter Series

Presentations last from four to eight hours, for those training, or interested in training interpreters.

Scope & Sequence

Multiple full-day *workshops* build on one another in terms of content and skills practice. Prerequisites must be met in order to attend subsequent sessions.

Workshop Series

Workshops can range from 1 day, 1½ days (3-hour presentation on day one, followed by a full-day workshop on day two) to 2 full days for maximum exposure and practice.
